The Harlem Independent Living Center, Inc. (HILC) is a nonprofit, disability-focused organization dedicated to empowering people with disabilities, advocating for a fully accessible society, and community change. HILC provides a comprehensive array of independent living services designed to allow individuals with disabilities to function independently within their communities. To address the lack of access to independent living services for individuals with disabilities in Harlem and surrounding areas, HILC was incorporated on May 31, 1990, with guidance from multiple partners. HILC's team of trained professionals — many of whom are disabled themselves or have direct experience with disabilities — provides essential support, advocacy, and guidance. They empower individuals with disabilities, along with their families and friends, by equipping them with the information, resources, and skills needed to live independently.
